Your board has been working hard to find a solution for the Competition Judging Format we use in our Monthly Meetings.

There have been many opinions and we have tried to listen to them all.

We have taken the positive suggestions you have shared with us into consideration and combined them to develop a solution. We hope you will see the advantages and realize this is from a compilation of club members' thoughts.

The board has approved the system I am presenting now. I want to thank the board for all the help they have provided, the time given, and heartfelt evaluations made.

I have created a presentation for you to read. It explains the format I have created from your many suggestions.

This system retains comments by the judges on all images.

It provides for those who do not wish to have their images judged.

It includes two additional evaluation opportunities for those who wish to take advantage of them.

It affords privacy for those who seek it.

It allows more time for judges to compose comments so improved evaluations are expected

All these things will develop the contest's teaching/learning potential.

It requires less manpower and is expected to save time.

I hope you appreciate these advantages and realize it is a newborn and not a college graduate.

Most of all I hope you learn more about photography and have fun doing so.

The Customized Judging Format

- •During the socialization period at the very first part of the evening, when images come in, entrants will place mounted/matted prints on easels along with a completed contest entry form. Entries are limited to two.
- •Judges will perform judging during program.
- •The Lightbox will be available there so the judges can use it to evaluate the images as they see fit.
- •The place awarded by the judges will be written on the entry form. This record of results will then go to the record keeper.
- •Entrants may place a scoring card with their image if they wish.

 The Judges will mark scores on areas of evaluation so the entrant can read that and retain the card for review. Scoring will consider, True to theme, Impact, Composition, Artistic Merit etc.
- •When the Monthly Meeting Program is over, the images will be presented to the judges one at a time for comments.

During the judges' comments, images will be presented where everyone can see them.

Members may opt out of the commentary portion if they desire. Ribbons will be awarded at this time.

Awarded entrants will be allowed to comment on their image (time permitting), on how the imaged was made, for example. (This is an Opportunity for the once in a while question from the viewing members.)

- •Award winners may be photographed as a group before sitting down. Limit entries to two.
- •At the end of Monthly Meeting judges will remain in the area of the easels offering private critiquing to any member who seeks personal, more in depth comments or evaluation.
- •Entries will be standardized and mounted on a 16 x 20 matt/mount (black or white). **No frames, no glass**. Minimum print size will remain at 8 x 10.....maximum 16 x 20.
- •We will not have an Open theme <u>each</u> month but only as scheduled when offered as a "theme for the month".
- •We will Utilize Two or Three judges for each contest.

The Judges will be allowed to award a tie if they need to.

Please recognize that this is a work in progress and will be fine tuned over time. Also remember that this is not a life sentence, nothing is carved in stone.

We shall be constantly evolving the format, and will do so together.

Your board is always there for you to share your thoughts. Now is no exception. I would ask, though, that you address all your positive comments to Crystal, Donna, and Mike, and all your concerns to me directly. They deserve the credit, I will take the blame.


