


Your Club President's Snapshot



Firstly, I would like to thank all the members who helped make our "Carrousel" at last month's meeting a success. Without your photographs, it could not have happened, and without your serious participation it would not have achieved the results it did.

We were able to view photographs that had not been acknowledged at our past monthly awards. We could see just how good many of the images were. We were able to constructively comment upon them and freely discuss their merits while noting how we might have improved or changed what we saw.

It was encouraging seeing members chatting and debating, one on one, about things "photographic". Some new friendships were made for sure. It was also evident, from the verbal commentaries after each round, that even our youngest members are very capable photographers and know exactly what they are trying to achieve as photographic artists. Theirs and everyone else's subjectivity was clearly evident.

In this month's newsletter we are featuring some "panels" submitted by individual members for you to view and assess. We have several "panels" featuring the Vero Beach air-show as the subject and two "panels" of the July 4th. Fireworks.

For members who are not quite familiar with the term "panel", it means a collection of a similar number of photographs whose subject covers the same topic. In some international competitions photographers often enter a "panel", of three or five photographs mounted separately but similarly. For instance there could be five images on cars, or trees, or faces, but again the panel rules might require that all the panels entered in that particular competition are of just one subject, i.e. "Trees". More often than not, the panel grouping is required to be assembled by more than one photographer, a team. The team usually is of an odd number of participants such as

Understanding what is required of you as a photographer and therefore also a judge, we shall continue to offer a series of suggestions that will help you in your critiquing. During this next winter season we shall from time to time examine photographs and then try to understand why they were award winners or were passed over. We'll see if an area of improvement might exist. Below is a concise guide to help you see what you see!

Indian River Photo Club - A Guide to Judging Photographic Images

Your comments, as a judge, should **help** the photographers improve their work. Be positive – comment on positive aspects of the photo and also provide suggestions for improvement.

Comment on *all* aspects of the photograph – Composition, Technical quality, Artistry and Emotional impact.

Firstly, things to consider about **COMPOSITION:**

- Balance, clarity, purpose ...
- Look for lines, shapes and other visual elements
- Does the photograph have (or even need) a strong center of interest?
- Does the background add to the image or distract the viewer?
- Is the strength of the image its simplicity or its complexity?

Secondly, things to consider about **TECHNICAL QUALITY:**

- Focus (sharpness or blur), depth of field, exposure, lighting, colors ...
- Does the photographer use techniques that compliment his/her intent?

Thirdly, things to consider about EMOTIONAL APPEAL or "Wow Factor":

- Does the image attract your attention on first viewing?
- Does the image hold your attention?
- Is the image provocative, unusual?
- Does the image address the competition theme in a creative way?

Make an effort to understand what the photographer is trying to say. Don't suggest the photographer shoot the way you would do.

By all means draw on your own experience, but try not to let your personal preferences determine your comments. Feel free to suggest things such as using a polarizer (or not), a tripod, fill-in flash, a color correcting filter, cropping, moving to a different location and so on where it might help the photographer produce a better image next time.

Conclude your remarks by giving the photo an overall score out of 10.

- 1, 2, 3 Extremely poor to poor, with serious faults.
- 4, 5 Fair, possibly minor faults
- 6, 7 Good
- 8 Excellent
- 9, 10 Exceptional

Remember that our objective is to encourage members to gain stature and **not** to discourage their efforts.

1, 2, and 3 should rarely be used. The score of an image that is technically good and generally pleasing should be 6 or 7 out of 10. Use 8 to 10 very sparingly.





The North County Library Indian River Photo Club Exposition 2016





- Photo must have been taken by the entrant.
- Participants are limited to three (3) entries. Additional entries will be ignored.
- Lake County Board of County Commissioners employees are not eligble to participate.
